BLUE WATER, WARM SAND AND DRINKS WITH LITTLE UMBRELLAS 2010

Back surgery demands its sacrifices. Since the "Prez" could not snow ski this season, my lovely bride and I had to make do with a short stay in San Juan and a cruise in the Caribbean. Actually, we arrived in San Juan two days before the cruise, and very much enjoyed touring the city while staying at the Marriott Resort and Casino in new San Juan. We had a beautiful room which overlooked the Atlantic Ocean. While it was 17 degrees in Dallas, we were rewarded by 85 degree days mixed with some rain which the folks called "liquid sunshine".

Old San Juan, just across the bridge from New San Juan, was on a major trade route controlled by the Spanish during the early years of the new world. It became an important port and was protected by two forts overlooking the bay. We toured Castillo San Cristobal, the older of the two forts. Life must have been hard for the average soldier. There are also ample places to shop for goodies, walking on old world cobblestones, and some of the best cigars I have ever smoked. The US dollar is the currency, and prices are comparable with the mainland US.

Saturday afternoon, we boarded the cruise ship Celebrity Summit starting our cruise to five islands in the West Indies. The ship was classified as a medium size ship accommodating 2000 passengers, and 950 support staff from 52 different countries.

Through the next 6 days, we experienced turquoise water, warm sand, plenty of sunshine and drinks with little umbrellas. The ports that we visited were Philipsburg, St. Maarten, Roseau, Dominica, St. George's Grenada, Scarborough, Tobago, and Bridgetown, Barbados. The islands were filled with history, beginning with discovery by Christopher Columbus. Over the next 250 years, the islands were occupied by Spanish, French, Dutch and English conquerors. Each culture left their mark on the islands. The Celebrity Summit was one of the best ships we have ever experienced. The five restaurants consistently produced outstanding culinary delights and great service. Our room, with balcony, was slightly larger than the average cabin. The balcony provided an oasis for R & R, and spectacular views of the ports of call.

The ship provided many shore excursions to choose from in the various ports. In addition, on board activities included dance lessons cooking lessons, movie theaters, and multi live performances. You could do as much or as little as you desired.

Saturday, January 16th we returned to San Juan for the flight back to Dallas. We had time to tour the Bacardi rum distillery in San Juan prior to returning to the airport. We were blessed with "liquid sunshine" on our final day, and drinks of Bacardi Rum.
